Ponderings in the Pasture- Pastor Gutz

On the morning of November 5th while other Christians were singing hymns or opening their Bibles or taking communion, a gunman was opening fire on the First Baptist Church of Sutherland Springs, Tex. It ended with 26 people killed including children. That is not a pleasant thing to think about. I don't want to think about it, but I have and I'm guessing that many of you have as well.

Such acts of violence defy reason. If it made sense then it would make sense. You can't make sense out of senseless events. As time goes on there will be more acts of violence. It has happened in the past and it will happen again. It could happen at a church or shopping mall or ball game or any place groups where people gather. This incident in Texas is not the first act of horrible violence neither will it be the last.

People committing violence is nothing new. In the first two chapters of Genesis you have the account of creation. The account of Adam and Eve disobeying God and eating the forbidden fruit is recorded in chapter 3. In chapter 4 you have the first murder. One brother murders another. Violence! Two chapters later in Genesis 6 it says, *"Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence. And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth. And God said to Noah, 'I have determined to make an end of all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. (ESV)* 6 chapters into the Bible and it says the earth was filled with violence! It's nothing new!

Centuries later the prophet Habakkuk gave voice to a question we often ask. Why? *"O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you 'Violence!' and you will not save? Why do you make me see iniquity, and why do you idly look at wrong? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise." (ESV) Habakkuk 1:2-3*

Violence. People committing violence. It's nothing new. And because of this violence - we grieve. Our hearts are troubled when we learn of tragedies. News reports and the constant barrage of media hold these things in front of us and we are troubled. Apart from the root cause of sin, we cannot explain why these things happen. God promises no answers on this.

When terrible things happen like what happened in Texas, or even closer to home when a loved one gets cancer or someone you care about is killed in a car accident we wonder why. Someone may say, "How could God let this

happen? If God is a loving God and a powerful God then why does He let these things take place?" People might even demand answers from us. "You're a Christian. You say your God is a loving God and a powerful God, why would he let this happen?"

What answer can we give? We don't know. We don't know. And it's okay to say that. "We don't know" is an answer. Not a very satisfying one but it is an answer and it is the truth. We simply do not know why God allows certain things to happen. We shouldn't think we can give answers where there aren't any.

But here's what we do know. We do not grieve as though who have no hope. *"But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep." (1 Thess. 4:13-14)*

This is what we do know. We believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We believe in the resurrection of the physical body and the life everlasting.

God is still present and at work in our life no matter how the situation may appear. As Jesus hung on the cross on Good Friday, it appeared that God was nowhere to be found in the midst of failure, suffering, death and defeat. Where was God when these things were happening? We learn from God's Word that He was there. He was in the suffering and the dying. The resurrection on Easter demonstrated that the cross had in fact been His most powerful action to save us. Because we have seen God work in this way through Christ, we can trust that his love and care is true for us, even if the circumstances seem to provide little evidence for this.

This faith is grounded in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is the living hope that carries us through the often unpleasant changes of this life. Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. This conquers death and guarantees that our Lord Jesus will raise us on the Last Day and "will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself" (Philippians 3:21). If only for this life we have hoped in Christ we of all men are most to be pitied. But Christ has indeed been raised from the death - the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. (1 Cor. 15:19-20)

Yes in the midst of death and violence we grieve. But we do not grieve as though who have no hope.
