Ponderings in the Pasture – Pastor Gutz

Be encouraged. Jesus is Lord. He is on His throne. Your life is in His hands. He is the Good Shepherd. You are one of His dear sheep. You are loved and forgiven in Christ. Those aren't new or novel statements. Those are statements of truth from God's Word. It is important for you to hear them again and again.

Being a follower of Jesus is difficult and challenging. That applies to a number of circumstances. Being a good worker is difficult and challenging; being a parent is difficult and challenging, getting old is difficult and challenging. That doesn't mean those things are bad. It is

acknowledging that those circumstances can be difficult and challenging.

We get the idea that following Jesus is easy. We think it will make my life better. If I'm good or do the right things God will be on my side. If I do this then God will do that. That is NOT Christianity. That is superstition. It sounds attractive and it sells - but it is not what our Savior teaches.

Jesus teaches no matter how bad it gets, He is with us. "Yea though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil for Thou art with me." (Ps. 23) Jesus said, "In this world you will have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

James reminded his readers, "Count it all joy, by brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness." (James 1:2)

Paul wrote to the young pastor Timothy, Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ

Jesus will be persecuted . . . (2 Tim 3:12)

When we find ourselves in difficult or challenging situations, we can remember - there's nothing wrong with me. Jesus said there would be trouble in this world. He can use those troubles to draw us closer to Himself. God told the Apostle Paul that His grace would be sufficient no matter what the circumstance for His power is made perfect in weakness. (2 Cor. 12:9)

The writer of the book of Hebrews says the Christian life is like a race. "Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." A race has a beginning and an end, a start and a finish. This race is not a sprint. It's a long distance race - an endurance event. You were entered into this race at your baptism and you will reach the finish line at death.

Long distance running calls for training, patience, and perseverance. You don't go out and run a marathon one day. A marathon is 26.2 miles. It takes weeks and months of training to prepare to complete that distance. Training allows the body to accommodate itself to running without getting injured. The body adapts to the training. It doesn't happen overnight, but gradually. The runner has to put in the time and miles, week after week, month after month.

In a similar way following Jesus takes training, patience, and perseverance. What at first you thought was overwhelming you find yourself doing. It is possible for you to be more patient. It is possible for you to be more forgiving. It is possible for you to live each day in joy. That doesn't happen overnight or as soon as you say your prayers, but gradually. Real fruit and produce takes time. Our Lord promises, I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. John 15:5-6

We gather for worship regularly. We work to be in God's Word daily along with prayer. This is difficult and challenging. We get tired and worn out. Christians can feel that way. It doesn't mean you don't have faith, it is part of the challenge. We need encouragement. Hebrews chapter 11 is the "Faith" chapter of Bible. It lists and reminds us of men and women who have gone before us, who have endured and did not give up. Keep your eyes on Jesus.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. Hebrews 12:1-3

This is an area where we can encourage and support. Followers of Jesus have been on the frontlines of defending life - from womb to tomb. Human life is valuable. Humans were made in the image of God! You will always have that over us cats. That's good. It's part of God's design. Encourage married couples to have children! That's how the kingdom grows! Life is a gift from God.
